1 CYPRUS

Loan: €21 million

Borrower: Cyprus

Aim: Increase priority investments in school infrastructure across education levels via an additional loans, benefiting at least 3 575 students.

2 ESTONIA

Loan: €20 million

Borrower: City of Tartu

Aim: Support municipal investments that modernise schools and kindergartens to improve safety, accessibility and energy-efficiency.

3 KOSOVO

Loan: €12 million

Borrower: Kreditimi Rural i Kosovës (KRK), a microfinance institution

Aim: Strengthen access to finance for micro and small businesses in Kosovo, reaching around 4 800 beneficiaries, explicitly targeting low-income clients.

4 LATVIA

Loan: €40 million

Borrower: ALTUM, Latvia's state development finance institution

Aim: Expand long-term housing finance outside Riga and its surrounding region, enhancing affordable access for about 2 000 households.

5 NETHERLANDS

Loan: €100 million

Borrower: Stichting Nationaal Warmtefonds, the Netherlands' national residential energy-efficiency fund

Aim: Facilitate energy-efficiency upgrades and small scale renewable energy installations in private homes.

6 POLAND

Loan: €25.8 million

Borrower: Warsaw School of Economics

Aim: Refurbish a historic campus building for improved safety, accessibility and energy performance and construct a new multi purpose pavilion via an additional loan.

7 SERBIA

Loan: €110 million

Borrower: Serbia

Aim: Complete planned upgrades and renovations to healthcare infrastructure across the country via an additional loan.

8 SLOVENIA

Loan: €150 million

Borrower: SID Banka

Aim: Expand social and affordable public rental housing in Slovenia, delivering around 1 200 affordable rental homes for about 3 000 people.

9 SPAIN

Loan: €200 million

Borrower: Comunidad Autonoma de Andalucia

Aim: Finance community based, residential and home based care services and upgrades to social care infrastructure.

10-11 UKRAINE

Loan: €100 million

Borrower: Ukraine

Aim: Reinforce Ukraine's HOME programme by continuing to support the national compensation mechanism for residential properties destroyed by the war.

Loan: €20 million

Borrower: Ukraine

Aim: Boost access to affordable finance for micro enterprises and small farms in Ukraine.
